

AQuA Minutes: July 16, 2022

Susan Sanmann called the meeting to order.

Treasure's Report: Balance of \$8465.12. A deposit has been made to Redlands Community Center for meeting space from September through December.

Survey: There were 30 responses. 60% have entered Mancuso shows and 65.5 expect to enter future shows. Reasons for not entering: not making quilts right now, time constraints, theme, size, and confidence.

Theme Ideas: Mary Grande organized the list into categories and the committee selected several to be voted on by members in attendance. Selected were RED, to be completed by the April meeting and WILD AND WACKY to be turned in next July.

The survey revealed that members are pleased with the financial contributions coming from our City Market Funds going to the same three organizations as last year: District 51, the Veteran's Center and the Art Center. It was expressed that this is a broad outreach, assisting a great section of the community.

AQuA will have a 10 X 10 booth at the Art Festival on October 8. The booth is free and has been secured by Julia Crocetto. A pop-up tent is needed. Chris Coolidge and Jacque Weimer volunteered to chair the committee.

The retreat will be held at Redlands Community Center on November 4 and 5. The cost per attending member is \$10. Jacque Weimer will be assisted by Bonnie Stenger and Share Weiser. Member demonstrations are encouraged!

Our workshop with Sandra Mollen will be June 7-9, 2023, at the Redlands Community Center. Registration date will be announced and will open online two weeks later.

A challenge has been issued for works that are 8" X 10". There is no theme. These works will be entered in the Art Center Member Show and should be ready to turn in at the November meeting.

Julia Crocetto is presenting an INDIGO workshop after the September 17th meeting. Cost is \$10. Bring your lunch and 2 yards of fabric to work with. One yard needs to be white. Julia will teach 4 basic techniques.

Our August 20 meeting is our annual Pot Luck and White Elephant Auction. Please note this meeting will begin at 10 o'clock. Bring food to share and sale items.

Our meeting place will change to the Redlands Community Center in September, at 2463 Broadway.

Show and Tell included: Sharon Braunagel's fan quilt, a coloration with her mother, who was in attendance; Cindy Williams and Chris Coolidge showed scrolls the Critique Group has been working on, Eldrid Schafer, Tana LaDkuke, and Jeanette Davis showed fabric samples from soy wax and ice dyeing sessions.

There are 14 quilts entered for "In My Dreams". Our Viewer's Choice was ABANDONED DREAM by Jacque Weimer.
